Message from the NDA President

The summer is winding down and fall will soon be upon us. Our 106th annual convention was full of energy and enthusiasm as our members, friends, and family gathered at the Renaissance Hotel in downtown Washington DC. The theme of this year's convention, Bridging Generations: Keeping Cultural Traditions Relevant in the New Oral Health Era was evident throughout the programs and activities prepared for attendees. Before our opening session, in keeping with our mission and tradition, the launch of NDA- HEALTH NOW-Metro DC® was held on site. Close to 200 hundred children and pregnant women were in attendance at the community outreach program and perinatal health fair and symposium. The event was generously supported by our community stakeholders, corporate partners both old and new, and was a model for future interprofessional collaborations. Concurrently, the Minority Faculty forum was engaged in "Bridging the Cultural Divide in Oral Health Equity". The ongoing efforts of our educators, administrators, and practitioners not only broadens the perspective of our student doctors, but also has a profound effect on the attitude and ideas about healthcare within the communities we serve. During the Minority Faculty, Administrator's and Practitioner's Luncheon, Dr. Jeanne C. Sinkford received the first NDA Lifetime Achievement Award. Those that arrived early were able to take advantage of the complementary passes to the National Museum of African American History and Culture. The afternoon was the time our leadership engaged in our ongoing leadership development training in the Eddie G. Smith Leadership Institute. Good governance, and the effective and responsible management of an organization, can only occur through consistent education and ethical standards. All levels of our leadership receive this training to maintain stability within the various segments of our association and to provide continuity for the future.

Receptions were held before the opening session to welcome distinguished guests, friends, and family to the convention. Mr. Noel Wallace, the new President and CEO of Colgate-Palmolive joined us for the first time since assuming his post. He delivered greetings and made a presentation during the Opening Session. After an inspired performance by the Cardinal Sheehan School Choir of Baltimore, Maryland, selected and supported by Colgate, several awards were presented. Dr. Jeanne C. Sinkford, Dean Emeritus of Howard University College of Dentistry received the in NDA Legend award for her lifetime achievements. The life membership award was presented to NDA Past President Dr. Sheila R. Brown. Chairman of the Board, Dr. Cheryl Y. Lee, and NDA Past President Dr. Hazel J. Harper Johns, received the President's award. The Special Recognition award was presented to Dr. Kim Turner and Assistant Secretary,

Dr. Nicole Cheek. Dr. Jerel Owens was the recipient of the Delegate of the Year award. The continuing education throughout all the family organizations which includes our student programs, consisted of highly desired topics presented by nationally known speakers. We even had a live implant surgery on site as part of the CE program. The President's Symposium was one of the highlighted plenary sessions open to everyone. The panel of speakers were icons of industry and healthcare from the public and private sectors. Dr. Hazel Harper Johns served as a moderator for this

The National Dental Association (NDA) launches NDA-HEALTH NOW-Metro DC®

The National Dental Association (NDA) launched its signature program, NDA-HEALTH NOW®, in Washington, DC, Thursday, July 18, 2019. The convention community outreach, a permanent feature of the annual convention, was conducted in partnership with the Colgate Bright Smiles, Bright Futures® Program at the Renaissance Downtown Hotel. Collaborators in this event were SNDA, Howard University College of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene Department, the Robert T. Freeman Dental Society, and the Washington, DC Chapter of the Links, Incorporated. Program sponsors included Colgate, Delta Dental Insurance Company and DentaQuest. Other supporters were the Henry Schein Cares Foundation, Hear to HEAL, Inc., Sunstar, and VOCCO.

The children's program was a dental field trip for Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Washington summer campers that included "Passport to Total Health™", an educational circuit with seven (7) stations. The stations are: Happy Smiles are Healthy Smiles, Oral Hygiene Instructions, Sports Injury and Accident Prevention, Brush-a-Thon, Oral Health Video Theater, Step-Up-to-STEM, and the Colgate Bright Smiles, Bright Futures® van. The Oral Health Video Theater showed educational videos including the cartoon "Dr. Rabbit and the Tooth Avengers" and "Links to Healthy Smiles", an educational video produced by The Links, Incorporated. Step-Up-to-STEM is an age-appropriate children's program with an oral health focus. This captivating program was developed for NDA-HN by dental students, members of the Student National Dental Association. The DC program featured presentations, demonstrations and interactive exercises for ages 5

through 12. One of the highlights for the children was doing “fillings” on dentoform teeth that were previously prepared by Howard dental students. It was made even more fun with the multi-colored sparkly composite material donated by VOCO. There was tons of fun to be had inside the hotel, but there was more fun waiting on the outside as well.

Colgate’s mascot, Dr. Rabbit, was on hand to escort the children to the Colgate Bright Smiles, Bright Futures® van located on the sidewalk of the hotel. On the van, the children received oral screenings and even more information on how to keep their mouths healthy. The children enjoyed going on the van and getting the goody bags with dental products and fun educational activities inside. Colgate is long-time partner of the NDA and the major sponsor of NDA-HN. The Colgate Bright Smiles, Bright Futures® program has also helped launch NDA-HN projects in Chicago, Dallas, New York, New Orleans, Atlanta and Orlando.

About NDA-HEALTH NOW®:

Formed in 2012 with a planning grant from the Links Foundation, the project goals are to 1) increase health care access; 2) eliminate disparities; 3) increase health literacy; and 4) promote prevention. NDA-HN also features and promotes the interests of interprofessional health teams. In 2016, NDA-HN won an award from the American Society of Association Executives, and since its inception has implemented and/or supported 122 programs in 15 cities and 7 countries; and galvanized a massive volunteer network. The results include nearly 50,000 direct beneficiaries including children and adults and more than one million mass media and social media exposures.

DTAF Award Supports Perinatal Health Event at DC Convention

Greenbelt, MD- The National Dental Association (NDA) launched NDA-HEALTH NOW (HN)-Metro DC® on July 18, 2019 during the NDA's annual convention in Washington, DC. The HN-DC launch included a new feature, a Perinatal Health Event, whose genesis came from a grant award from the Dental Trade Alliance Foundation.

The event took place from 8:30 a. m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Renaissance Hotel Downtown DC. Major sponsors were Aetna, AARP, Colgate, Delta Dental, the Dental Trade Alliance Foundation and DentaQuest. Other supporters were CVS Health, and the Henry Schein Cares Foundation. Community collaborators included AmeriHealth Caritas District of Columbia, Howard University College of Dentistry, the Robert T. Freeman Dental Society, and the Washington, DC Chapter of the Links, Incorporated.

In 2018, the NDA was one of ten, out of over two hundred applicants, to receive a grant award from the Dental Trade Alliance Foundation (DTAF). The grant was awarded to the NDA to create a new initiative to address the lack of dental care in pregnant women and the alarming rates of infant and maternal mortality among African American women. One of the components of the new initiative was the perinatal health event. The program, "Linking Oral Health to Total Health for Expectant Moms" is being piloted in DC's Ward 7 and includes not only a focus on oral health, but also on the health and wellbeing of perinatal African American women. Interprofessional (IP) collaboration (including all aspects of health—physical and mental—as well as the social determinants that impact birth outcomes) is a major focus of the pilot project. Pregnant women are one of the nation's most vulnerable and underserved populations, and prenatal dental care is a predictor of birth outcomes; but most expectant mothers do not include dental visits as part of their prenatal care. Although decades of research has linked poor birth outcomes to poor oral health during pregnancy, recent findings also reveal increasing rates of infant and maternal mortality in African American women.

Factors contributing to these preventable conditions are a general lack of awareness about the link between oral health and healthy babies; lack of communication and collaboration between health providers; misconceptions about dental care during pregnancy; and lack of dental professionals able and willing to treat this target group. African American women also report highest levels of stress, lack of compassionate care and inadequate support networks.

Pregnant women are one of the nation's most vulnerable and underserved populations and prenatal dental care is a predictor of birth outcomes;

The NDA-HEALTH NOW® pilot focuses on services, education and access. The project includes courses and hands-on training conducted for physicians and nurses to increase oral health competencies; and advanced training for dentists featuring new guidelines and protocols. OB-GYNs and nurses are encouraged to conduct oral health assessments, education and dental referrals at the first prenatal visit. The DTAF award also provided for the development of a Resource Directory, including prenatal medical-dental networks and existing community, family



support programs. The vision is that all these interventions will have impact, on multiple levels, to improve oral health and overall health, influence policy changes, improve maternal and child health, and promote IP integrated health systems.

One hundred women were invited to attend the perinatal health event which included a Perinatal Health Fair and Luncheon Symposium. The goal of the Perinatal Health Fair was to increase access to prenatal health care (medical, dental and mental) by not only increasing awareness through education, resources and information; but also by providing intimate roundtable discussions with community and family support groups in a “safe space”. The unique program, planned for women by women, featured medical, dental and mental health screenings; Ask-the-Experts; round table discussions; and an Information and Resource Center. The Health Fair concluded with a Perinatal Luncheon Symposium under the theme of the 2019 NDA-Women’s Health Symposium – “Mindfulness in Sisterhood-A Time to Share, Support and Soar!” The Mistress of Ceremonies was WRC-TV anchor Molette Green. Featured speakers were: Dr. Mary Lee Conicella (Dentist); Dr. Joy’El Ballard (OB-GYN); Dr. Barbara Brown (Psychologist); and Reverend Georgia Davis (March of Dimes/Stork’s Nest DC program director).

The event attracted multiple stakeholders, community and national participants including: Mamatoto Village, March of Dimes, AARP,

American Academy of Pediatrics/Centers for Disease Control, Stork’s Nest, Assembly of Petworth, National Maternal and Child Oral Health Resource Center, Children’s Dental Health Project, National Alliance on Mental Illness, DC Black Nurses Association, Capitol Hill Consortium for Counseling & Consultation LLC, the NIH Office of Research on Women’s Health, and the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research.

Results from the survey respondents attending the event are very promising and will be used for future planning:

- Did health care providers at the event make you feel supported and your health concerns are taken seriously? 100% responded “yes”
- After attending this event, do you feel more connected to a community support network that will help you and your family? 100% responded “yes”
- Overall, how would you rate the Perinatal Health Fair? 80% rated fair as “excellent” and 20% rated as “good”
- After attending this event, do you feel more knowledgeable about community support networks that will help you and your family? 100% responded “yes”
- 90% rated the Information and Resource Center as the “most useful” kiosk at the Health Fair.

NDA Partnerships and Collaboration Updates

American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP)

NDA and ASCP are working on a joint MOU in the areas of clinical pathology and clinical dental care delivery on diabetes and the manifestation of the disease discerned through testing and clinical observation

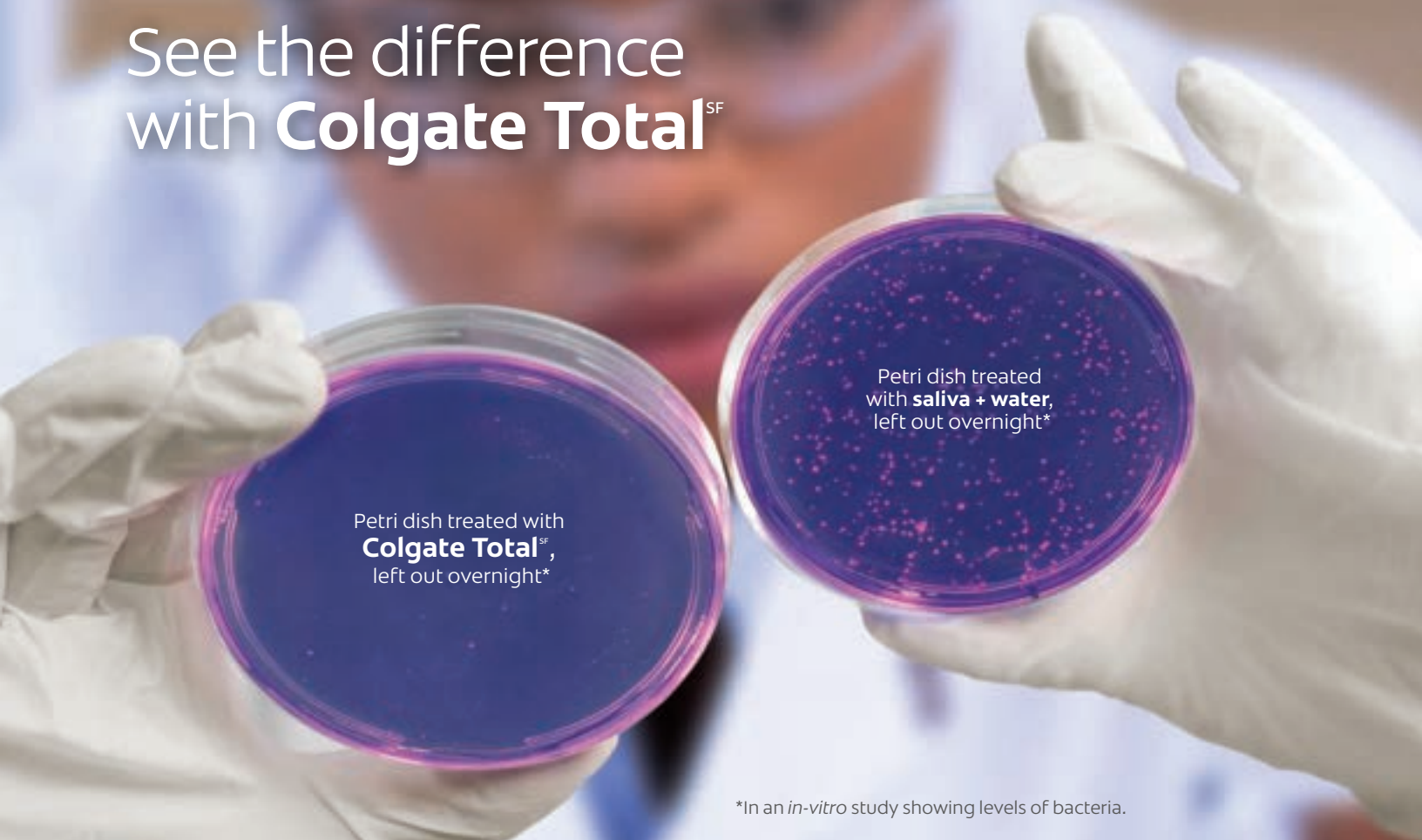

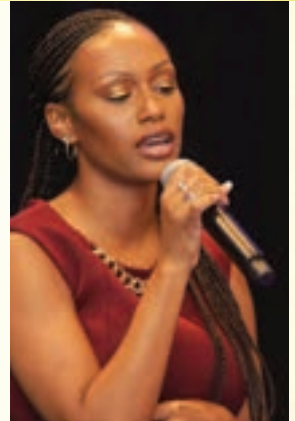

President's Symposium

“Bridging the Health Gap in the 21st Century: The Role of Sectors – Public. Private. Philanthropic.”

The National Dental Association hosted its President's Symposium at its 106th Annual Convention in Washington, DC. The discussion was driven by the theme “Bridging the Health Gap in the 21st Century: The Role of Sectors – Public, Private, Philanthropic.” AARP's Dr. Catherine Alicia Georges, Henry Schein's Mr. Stanley Bergman and the U.S. Assistant Surgeon General Rear Admiral Timothy Ricks gave information packed presentations on both the current and projected roles of different sectors. Professionals shared information on trends in oral and overall health, ultimately providing members with projected solutions to bridging the health gap. **The event was supported by AARP, Henry Schein, Inc. and an educational grant from GlaxoSmithKline.**

Leading the conversation was Mr. Stanley Bergman, CEO and Board Chairman of Henry Schein, Inc. Mr. Bergman's presentation titled “The Power of Us” shed light on current trends affecting dentistry, some of which were sluggish economic growth, digital disruption, consumerism, ongoing demographic changes, reimbursement, retain orthodontic providers and the rise of Dental Support Organizations (DSO's).

He spoke about an even larger issue in public health, Non Communicable diseases (NCD's). Bergman reported in the U.S., where healthcare accounts for about 18% of the gross domestic product or GPD, NCD's account for well over half of such. He also stated that data confirms a greater reduction in health care expenditures when periodontal disease is removed from patients suffering from NCD's. Schein has partnered with the FDI, WHO, UNDP, NYU, and Tanzanian, Australian and Swedish governments, launched a program that helps grow culturally-specific professional organizations, in attempt to promote an understanding of the importance of oral health as a part of overall health access.

Mr. Bergman highlighted demographic changes as an industry shifting trend. He says we need to be sure we are delivering healthcare that matches the needs of the community. Bergman also says the dental community should reflect the population. By 2045, Bergman says the U.S. is projected to be a “majority minority” country. Success of organizations will depend primarily on the reflection of the constant increase in diversity. Bergman says *“diversity and cultural competency in the health care professions are essential to advancing care.”* Additionally, they have partnered with various NDA members who support Medicare coverage for medically-necessary oral/dental health therapies.

One method of strengthening Medicare is expanding coverage, says Dr. Catherine Alicia Georges, AARP National Volunteer President. Furthermore, a key part of this expanded coverage is making dental benefits a basic part of Medicare, she says. As almost 2/3 of everyone on Medicaid has no dental coverage. Dr. Georges states, *“the absence of a policy is essentially a contradiction of good science.”* She adds *“It ignores a host of studies that show a direct link between oral health and overall health.”* As more and more disabled and elderly individuals choose to stay in their homes, versus retirement and/or nursing homes, government policy should reflect such.

Georges reported that very few places serve individuals needing dental coverage through Medicare; however, over 58 million Americans use Medicare as the bedrock of their healthcare security. She advised that AARP is playing a lead role in a very visible and high stakes effort to bring down the high prices of prescription drugs. The price of prescription drugs has increased significantly and it is not fair, nor sustainable, says Dr. Georges. She informs members that there is a strong and growing movement to reduce drug prices - the “Stop RX Greed” campaign that about 14 states thus have taken action in, some even on the national level. What is it that we want as a



result of this action? “Choices”, Dr. Georges expresses. Some of those choices include Medicare having the authority to negotiate, legalizing safe importation of drugs that are sold at lower prices in other countries that can bring prices down, putting a cap on out of pocket costs for patients, stopping manufacturers from freezing out competition, greater transparency in drug pricing in advertisements and more.

AARP was instrumental in implementing notable acts in terms of its health agenda and contribution to the ACA, such as the RAISE Family Caregivers Act, which is leading to the creation of a national strategy to support family caregivers, Credit For Caring Act in which new tax credit up to \$3,000 is available to eligible working family caregivers, the Dementia Discovery Fund, the Global Council and more.

In closing, Admiral Timothy Ricks, Assistant Surgeon General and Chief Dental Officer of the U.S. Public Health Service, gave members an overview of the Surgeon General’s priorities regarding oral health. He reported that the Surgeon General’s priorities are: opioids and addiction, tobacco, community health and prosperity, health and national security, and emerging public health threats. The opioid epidemic continues to affect upward mobility in

dentistry (as we learned at our previous symposium), because dentists are responsible for a great deal of opioid prescriptions. Dr. Ricks suggests action steps should be taken prior to writing prescriptions. A few of these steps are: conducting medical and dental history checks to determine medicine and possible misuse, review CDC and state board suggestions for safe prescribing, registering with prescription drug monitoring programs, etc.

Dr. Ricks lectured on deaths related to tobacco use, as it affects both physical and oral health. Dr. Ricks advised that populations with poor health result in workforce shortages and injuries, decreased school performance and absence, delayed dental care, etc. It is important to change perceptions regarding oral health and disease so that oral health becomes an accepted component of health. By Fall 2020, Surgeon General Jerome Adams wishes to have polished his report describing and evaluating oral health, the interaction between oral and general health through the lifespan and new focuses in improving oral health equity across communities.

Following the event was mobile polling that fully engaged the audience on topics presented. Moderator, Hazel Harper Johns closed with graceful speech and kind regards.

The first National Dental Association Women's Seminar was held in the early 1980's under the direction of Dr. Marie Holliday (Dallas, TX). In 1982, having been denied a request to form a women dentists' interest group under the auspices of the NDA, Drs. Shirley Bailey and Emily Lee (Los Angeles, CA) founded the Association of Black Women Dentists (ABWD).

The group was organized to address the needs and concerns of African American female practitioners. Following a successful women dentists' luncheon at the 1989 NDA convention in Washington, D.C., the host committee became the founders of the first branch of the ABWD, the Women Dentists of Metropolitan D.C. In 1992, the NDA Annual Convention, held in New York, provided the opportunity to launch the first official Women Dentists' Awards Luncheon, chaired by Dr. Erica Bailey. During that convention, Dr. Hazel Harper (Washington, DC) presented the concept for a Women's Health Symposium (WHS), to be incorporated into the NDA annual convention, to the NDA Board of Trustees, and House of Delegates. The concept was approved and in 1993 the 1st Annual Women's Health Symposium was held in Boca Raton, Florida, under the leadership of Dr. Hazel Harper, the first National Chairperson. Since the first WHS event, Drs. Sheila R. Brown (Chicago, IL), Beverly Murdock (Somerset, NJ), and Angela Jamison Johnson (Atlanta, GA) have also served as National Chairpersons.

On Saturday, July 20, 2019 the NDA and the Robert T. Freeman Dental Society hosted the sold out Dr. Alison P. Riddle-Fletcher Women Dentist Awards Luncheon which included guest speaker Ms. Denise Joy Hart, who gave a lively presentation that included her guiding principles which she calls Listen-Obey-Prosper.

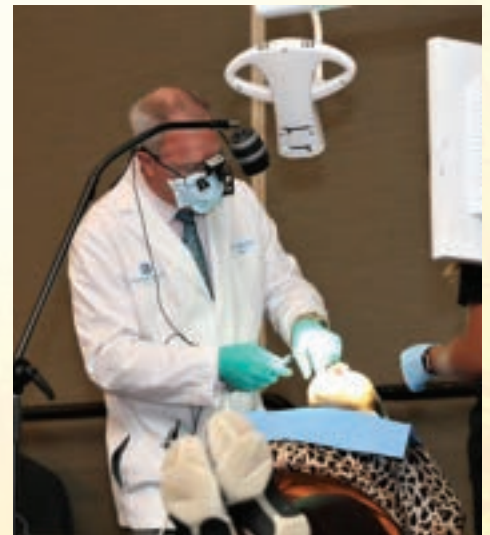
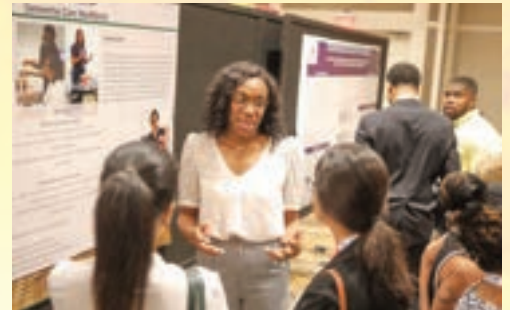
